This stone house has a comugated iron hipped roof with a rendered corbelled chimney to the south west. The stone work to the front of the building is finely pointed with red brick arches above the central entry

Although the original verandah has been replaced, the simple form of the place and the use of local stone gives the place aesthetic significance. The house demonstrates the use of local materials and contributes to the streetscape of the locale.

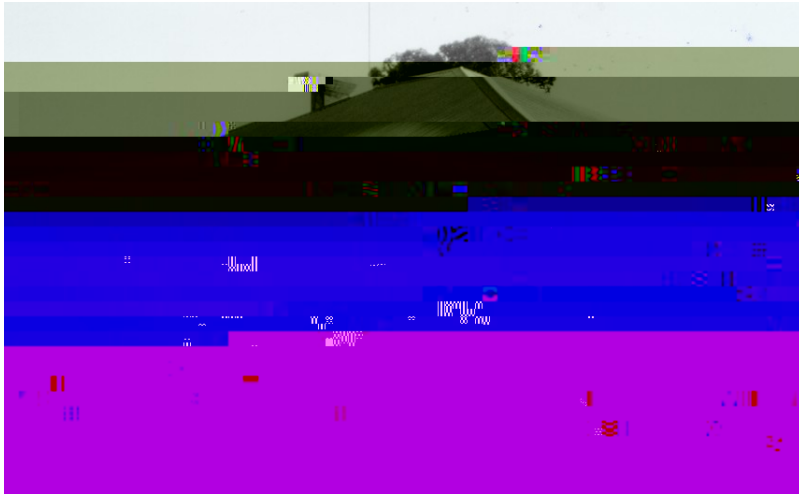
