Approval was granted to the owner to demolish this house for redevelopment purposes in 2007. At the time of the review, the building had been gutted but walls and roofing remained intact. Situated behind a tall limestone block wall with double metal entry gates, this rendered painted brick house has a gambrel comugated iron roof with a separate gable to the front (west) which covers the main room. The main roof extends to cover the front verandah which is supported on tuned timber posts with an arched timber frieze between. Windows are timber framed and double hung with coloured glass panes to the main room.
