Located on the east side of Brand Highway, approximately 1.2 kilometres south of Phillips Road is the ruin of "Hit or Miss". The consultants were unable to secure access to the property and therefore the following description is drawn from Feilman, M., "Greenough Historical Survey of the Front Flats":

Ruins of a three-roomed brick cottage which had a front verandah and corrugated iron roof. Nearby are the ruins of stone outbuildings and a well set amongst a cluster of trees.
