Set in an elevated position, this rendered stone house has a hipped comugated iron roof which extends to cover verandahs to the west and south, supported on timber posts. The verandah to the north west has been enclosed. Windows are timber framed and casement in style with small panes.

Walter Padbury was the first title holder of VL 734. Padbury bought land throughout the Front Greenough Flats, had a small cottage built and then leased the property to tenant farmers (see also Place Nos. 57 & 60). The original three roomed stone cottage was built in the 1860s. Franseco Brothers owned the property c 1904-1914. The farm was later owned by Mr & Mrs Hymus.
